



Certificate IV in Mental Health CHC43315

Our courses are delivered via a combination of online and face to face workshops, with study support available in Adelaide, Berri, and Port Augusta.

Overview

This qualification reflects the role of workers who provide self-directed recovery oriented support for people affected by mental illness and psychiatric disability.

The qualification is suitable for those who are seeking to develop specialist skills to work with clients who face challenges with their mental health, including those who have some work or volunteer experience in community services or health and want to branch out into mental health work.

The course will examine the link between mental health and other personal and community issues, as well as exploring mental health in the community and in the workplace. A focus on working with families dealing with mental health issues is also covered.

Work Placement Requirements

To achieve this qualification, students must have completed 80 hours of work as detailed in the Assessment Requirements of units of competency.

- All placements must be approved by the Institute prior to commencement to ensure the required work-based learning and assessment can be completed.
- Wherever possible, a work placement within a program of Relationships Australia SA will be organised, but this is not guaranteed, and students need to seek placements at other organisations.
- Students on placement within RASA must meet the mandatory requirements for working with children checks, National police clearance, and COVID-19 vaccinations.

Entry Requirements

There are no entry requirements for this qualification.

Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) Assessment

All applicants will be assessed for suitability and are required to undertake an online language, literacy and numeracy (LLN) assessment.

Employment Opportunities

Over 50 occupations fall under the community work banner and roles include intake, support, case work, crisis intervention, team management and advocacy. Community Services sector roles include:

Tuition Fee

Students will be required to undertake self-directed learning outside of classroom delivery.
