

Certificate IV in Youth Work

Your path to a rewarding career
working with young people.



Overview

This qualification supports the attainment of the skills and knowledge to develop, facilitate and coordinate projects for young people in a range of community based settings, to address the social, behavioural, welfare, health, developmental and safety needs of young people.

This training program is underpinned by the practice wisdom of Schools, Community, Innovations and Learning Service (SCILS) a youth specific service at Relationships Australia South Australia. Students will engage and learn from Youth Workers in the field and eligible students can complete the work placement component at SCILS.

Entry Requirements

All applicants will be required to undertake a suitability interview with the course coordinator.

Study Requirements

This program has 21 face to face classroom contact days. This program is equivalent to 5 to 10 hours of study per week. Students will also be required to undertake self-directed learning outside of classroom delivery.

Prior Recognition of Learning

You may be eligible for recognition of prior learning (RPL) for this qualification. Please see our website for more details.

Tuition Fee

Full fee: \$5,000

Participants eligible for SA Government subsidies: \$1,000 (Tuition Gap Fee)

Participants eligible for SA Government subsidies with valid concession card: \$520.00 (Tuition Gap Fee)

Duration & Delivery Mode

12 months. Blended learning – Online and compulsory classroom sessions.

Work Placement Requirements

To achieve competency for this qualification, 100 hours of on-the-job learning and assessment at a youth-specific service, must be completed.

- All placements must be approved by the Institute prior to commencement to ensure the required work-based learning and assessment can be completed.
- Wherever possible, a work placement within a program of Relationships Australia SA will be organised, but this is not guaranteed, and students need to seek placements at other organisations.

Please note: you have 12 months to complete your Work Placement from the completion date of your final Unit of Study (please refer to your timetable).
