a background in health, community services or education and those already providing services to support communities and individuals in either a volunteer or paid capacity.

All applicants must undertake a suitability interview with the course coordinator.

Study Requirements

This program has both face-to-face and online tutorial content.

This program has 19 face-to-face classroom contact days, 7 online forums plus a supervised student practicum of 4 days. This program is equivalent to 10 to 15 hours of study per week. Students will be required to undertake self-directed learning outside of classroom delivery.

Prior Recognition of Learning

You may be eligible for recognition of prior learning (RPL) for this qualification. Please see our website for more details.

Work Placement Requirements

There is no required workplace component for the CHC51015 Diploma of Counselling.

Duration & Delivery Mode

15 months. Blended learning – Online and compulsory classroom sessions.

Qualification Pathways

Participants may be eligible to undertake further qualifications at Advanced Diploma or Graduate Diploma level.

Overview

This qualification reflects the role of counsellors who work with clients on personal and psychological issues using established counselling modalities. Students will develop their integrative approach to counselling through face-to-face simulations and assessment with practice leaders within Relationships Australia South Australia.

The training combines best practices in online and face-toface delivery, supporting student engagement with regularly scheduled, synchronous classes and tutorials and asynchronous activities and assessments.

All students can access interactive e-textbooks and a course facilitator for ongoing support.

Students completing this course will be equipped with the skills and knowledge to work in a defined and supported counselling role in an established agency rather than in independent practice. This qualification will add practical experience to an existing qualification.
